Our guest speaker will be Dr. Mark Daley who holds a Ph.D in music from York University and is a musicologist, specializing in the history of popular music. He has taught at Guelph, McMaster, Waterloo and York Universities; he has toured the United States and Canada as a musician with Jeff Healey; and is also featured on dozens of recordings as a guitarist and singer. Mike will speak about Leonard Cohen's life and work, interspersing his narrative with classic Cohen songs. The

But for Mike, that deep, sometimes-morose voice has concealed the richness and variety of Cohen's musical and lyrical abilities. Mark is a speaker and entertainer you definitely won't want to miss.
