Message from the President



It was great to see so many people out for our first in-person general meeting in over 2 years. I want to thank those who attended and for wearing their masks - we had 100% compliance with this and that was great. I especially want to thank those people who did not attend because they had had some kind of contact with COVID in the few days prior. It is great to see how well we can help look after each other. I also want to thank Tom McKay for his insights into Crime Prevention - I did my Homework, did you?

Your social committee continues to excel and we are adding more and more in-person events each month. Our first Tastes of the World dinner evening was by all accounts excellent so thanks Maureen K for making this happen. We have a couple of river cruise options coming up, some community walks plans; Golf is now starting up again - thank you Peter L for organizing this again this year; and Gudran F has also taken up the daunting task of teaching a bunch of us how to lawn bowl.

You should also know that it's not just us that are 'back in business':

- The City of Pickering's 55+ Aging Well together program has announced '<u>In Person Programs</u> are back this season'
- There will be an <u>Artfest on the Esplanade</u> starting May 28th.
- The Chestnut Hill Developments Recreation Complex (aka The Rec Center) will be hosting a Grand Reopening on May 14th (and will be offering some entertainment and freebies!)
- and the Pickering Museum has also announced that 'Field Trips are back'

Talking about trips, We conducted a brief survey at our general meeting as to what types of events our members are interested in. Thanks to everybody who responded and it appears that the most popular types of events are Multi-Day trips and Cruises, Historical/Interesting places trips, 'Water trips' (river cruises, tall ship) and Theater trips. The Social Committee will now take action. Sorry ladies but a US Shopping Day did not cut it!

Another interesting and far more important survey is the Canadian Census and the latest figures released just a couple of days ago show that from 2016 to 2021 the number of Canadians aged 65 and older rose 18.3% to seven million (up 16.9% from the time of the last census). They also show that the Canadian population now has a larger proportion of people aged 55 to 64 (the age at which people leave the workforce) than it does of those aged 15 to 24 (the age at which people enter the workforce). To me, these results indicate that in the future there will be a lot of pressure on governments and local authorities to look after this older crowd! So I say again: Thanks to all our volunteers - an active PROBUS club means that us older folks can at least entertain ourselves.

By the way, we recently posted the latest Global Probus Newsletter on our site. You can find it on the Newsletter page (click here). It is fascinating reading and an indication, to me at least, that barriers are continuing to fall and that PROBUS is becoming a more global /cooperative venture. As I mentioned at our meeting, we as a club are already working more closely with other clubs in Durham. We now share our newsletters and are offering spots on some of our events to other clubs and vise-versa. I believe this new spirit of esprit de corps within PROBUS will likely continue to evolve over the next months and years.

A key upcoming day this month is May 23rd - Victoria Day - and being a curious soul I googled that. I discovered that Victoria Day is Canada's oldest non-religious holiday marking the birthday of Queen Victoria who ruled England for 63 years. Then, following her death, May 24th was decreed as Empire Day across the British Empire - so in theory we should get 2 days off, right? However it turns out that Canada is the only country in the world who still recognises these dates so I guess that is not going to happen. Of course, of much more importance to a lot of us is the fact that this holiday is also the unofficial beginning of summer, the opening up of cottage country and/or a chance for us to open our pools and get back to tending our gardens. As such, a lot of Canadians call it the 'May Two-Four' holiday - a time to celebrate by sharing a case of 24 beers and that works much better for me.

Finally, Happy Mothers Day to all you Mothers out there and I hope this will be an opportunity for you all to get together with family again.


