So now we are in August and being a curious soul I googled that. August got it's name for the Roman Augustus Caesar but before that it used to be the 6th month and was called 'Sextilis'. That sounds much more interesting, However, the Saxon name for the month was Weodmontha (which means weed month) and that seems very fitting. Strangely, August 16th is the date that two entertainment icons passed away from drug overdoses. Both Marilyn Monroe and Elvis Presley died on the 16th and apparently Elvis 'sightings' around the world increase

Oh and by the way, Happy Lammas Day! What is this you ask? Well, this observance marked the beginning of the harvest, and especially celebrated the first wheat or corn crop. The word "lammas" comes from the Old English hlaf, (loaf,) and 'maesse', (feast) and traditionally loaves of bread are baked from the first-ripened grain and brought to the churches to be consecrated and feasted on on this day. Plus, in Ireland, baskets of blueberries were offered to a sweetheart and in Scotland, the Lammastide fairs became famous for trial marriages that could be ended without question after a year. I believe the Irish tradition is still being practiced but I doubt the Scottish one is - shame.

Lammas Day also used to mark the mid-point between the summer solstice and autumn equinox and so much lore, paganism, rituals and superstitions are associated with this day. For example, breaking a Lammas Day loaf into 4 and placing a piece in each corner of a barn would protect the recently harvested grains. There is also this proverb: 'After Lammas Day, corn ripens as much by night as by day.' Funny, as a child, my parents shared lots of proverbs with me but I don't remember ever hearing that one (and to be honest, I have no idea what it means)!
