## Webmaster's Report



## Ontario Structured Psychotherapy (OSP) Program at CAMH

The OSP supports adults ages 18 or older who have depression, anxiety, and anxiety-related conditions. Through the OSP program, patients can access publicly funded, short-term, evidence-based cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT). CBT is a structured, time-limited therapy that is problem-focused and goal-oriented and teaches practical strategies and skills.
