So the club is now officially 5 years old. I looked back at our <u>Charter document</u> that recognized us as club #264 in Canada and discovered it was dated December 22nd, 2018. Our first meeting as a chartered club was on January 17th, 2019 and we had 84 members at that time. These are our Charter Members and the rest, as they say, is history.

Because of the dates mentioned above, our operating year has always been the same as the calendar year and, as such, our next meeting will also be our Annual General Meeting. At this meeting we will present annual financial and membership reports, a 2024 budget and most importantly, our management Team for 2024 will be formalized.

In accordance with our Bylaws, a Nominating Committee was established in November to determine what Management Team positions might need filling and to start the process to fill them. I want to thank the Leader of this Committee, **Greg Garber**, and his team of **Julia Tonks**, **Gail Gobeil**, **Nancy Agostino**, **Patricia Smith Robertson & Valerie Rodrigues** for successfully completing their assignment. The full text of their report is included below but I want to highlight the following:

- The team is largely unchanged and there are no vacancies to be filled at this time.
 This is especially good news for me (and hopefully you as well) as they are all exceptional individuals and working with this team is so very rewarding.
- **Peter Davidson** will be remaining on the team but in a reduced role. Peter has been on the team since the beginning and has done tremendous service for 5 years now. He has earned his break but I'm thrilled that the Team will still have access to his wise counsel for another year.
- Terri Abernethy will be our new Treasurer and Gail Gobeil our VP. Thanks to both for stepping forward.
- Patricia Smith Robertson has stepped down from the Team for personal reasons. I thank her also for her commitment.
- The Nominating Committee was able to set the new team in place in full accordance to our current Bylaws and Position Descriptions. However, it has become apparent that while these documents were perfectly adequate for a 200 member club, they need reviewing in light of the fact that we are now a 500 member club. Reviewing these will be a priority for our team in the upcoming months and if you have any comments or suggestions about them, I would welcome your input. Membership Report


PROBUS Pickering Lakeside is happy to welcome one new member that joined recently: David Owen.

Tickets are still available for this event. Cost is \$55.00




